Three were trained on Shielded Metal Art Works for 6 months while five young people underwent training for two months electrical Line maintenance.</li> <li>• Five secondary students whose ages were 15 years old and above were given training on repairing mobile phones to acquire skill and support the children on their school needs to prevent drop-out</li> </ul>	<p>April to August</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Short training courses equipped them skills that they can be economically gainful as free lancer and while still in school.</li> </ul>

<p>Psychological activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Counselling</li> <li>• Therapy</li> <li>• Group process</li> <li>• IQ test</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All children underwent, activities on group process and IQ test.</li> <li>• Counselling and therapy were administered to selected clients who are undergoing deep seated hatred and depression</li> </ul>	<p>March to May</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All children who took the Group process ventilated their ambivalent feelings from the experienced abused, exploitation and discrimination.</li> <li>• Counseling and Therapy were given to those children who were victims of sexual abused, neglect and abandonment</li> <li>• Support system was established for those who need "someone" to talk to.</li> </ul>
<p>Body mass index</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All children were assessed their age, height and weight to determine the issue on malnutrition</li> </ul>	<p>May</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• New children were identified as suffering from poor nutrition while the rest were in the stage of mild malnourished.</li> <li>• Only four were considered not malnourished</li> </ul>
<p>Medical and dental assistance</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The child's life was endangered by dengue fever. The child was in the 4th stage of dengue whose gum was bleeding and platelet was very low requiring for blood transfusion</li> </ul>	<p>September</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The organization have facilitated to bring the child to the hospital, provided blood for transfusion and other material support.</li> </ul>

<p>Police blotter and medico legal</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The case of two girls who were sexually abused by the father and step-father were reported to the police for blotter.</li> </ul>	<p>July</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Except for the mother, all members of the family were very supportive.</li> <li>• There was a collaborative action among local government unit and police officers.</li> </ul>

	Baranggay and Police blotter	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The case of 16 years old client who was a victim of early pregnancy was reported to the police and barangay.</li> </ul>	October	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Collaborative effort was made by the police and local government unit to protect the victim.</li> <li>The perpetrator was obliged to financially support thhe child before and after birth.</li> </ul>
