It has been very alarming to the many children both in elementary and high school graders to victims of being a bully and bullied.. In one of the schools where most of the kids of Gugma sa Kabataan were enrolled have experienced bullying leading to physical injury and dropped out. The worst effect of being bullied it motivated to suicide.

There were 39 campers together with 3 staff. MALISA HOME, a center for girls who were trafficked have joined this 2018 camp. It was held at MAPAWA NATURE PARK on April 23-27, 2018 with the theme "Overcoming Bullying." The end goal is for the kids to acquire life shaping skill communicating, handling emotion, conflict and make decisions. At the end of the camp the kids were able to"

- 1. Have a deeper knowledge on bullying;
- 2. Recognized and affirmed their capabilities in handling conflict situations
- 3. Express emotions in a more mature and creative way; and
- 4. Deepen the perspective on bullying from the legal, Biblical and psycho-social

The five days activities has provided the knowledge on the motivating factors on bullying and its effect. From the sociological, psychological, Biblical and legal perspective, the kids acquired knowledge and skill to be victorious in overcoming bullying. Play therapy was used to disclose themselves who they are, recognized and affirmed their capabilities and communicate their emotions in a creative and relaxing way. The kids were group into 6 families who have learned to be cooperative, worked as team, to follow rules, share their gifts as a leader, a follower, creative, caring and responsible to look after their group members.

Again, this Summer camp was made possible because of the abundant love of our benefactors from Germany, our members of the Board through the leadership of Dr. Stefan Wolfenstetter. Also, to the girls of MALISA HOME who added color to the faith journey of the children of Gugma sa Kabataan. Inc

# <u>Color your Life</u> Abegail Gallamora, B.S Psychology

Everyone was given a blank caricature of a male and female child. Crayons were provided for every child to choose from. Each child choose a color or colors that he/she has meaning in his/her life. Two circles were formed -inner and outer holding their painted caricature. Outer circle move around facing the inner circle. Colors identified were primary and secondary. Colors identified were:

- Red is for love, family, care, brave, blessing, happiness, respect, health, strong, Process and faith
  - Green is nature, love, hope, peaceful, reflective, rust, passion, optimistic, life care, thankful
  - Orange is light, humility, unity, happiness, joy, courage, hope and blessing
  - Brown is strong, religious, freedom, love, trials, life, challenges, failure
- <u>Blue</u> is tears, sadness, alone, water, peace, emotion, success, joy strong, future, priority
  - <u>Black</u> is fear, love, sin, punishment.sad down.destruction, challenges

Though black was considered by the majority as negative color of their lives two kids look at it positively as a challenge and love. Like the darkness of the night, gives us night rest, able to see the shining stars.



Pick up a Drinking Straw

Each family group was given a bunch of drinking straw. Each member will op scattered straw. Participant will pick it up without moving/disturbing other straw. When straw moved next players turns.

Who got the most and the least straw? The campers who got the most number of drinking straw pointed out that careful planning, focus and teamwork were to be considered most in solving problem and in making decisions. The child who got the least drinking straw expressed disturbance, nervous, lack of focus, far of not being able to solve the problem and confused on what to do.
